

Frequently Asked Questions

Do you deliver?

Yes. Our delivery fee is \$35 (in-town). We can deliver any of our products and our maximum loads for bulk materials are; 8 cubic yards of mulch, 5 cubic yards of dirt, and 4 cubic yards of stone.

Do you offer discounts for Landscape Companies?

We do not offer any discounts for landscape companies on bulk materials. There is a 5% discount available for anyone who buys 1 ton or more of a single product (must take all product at time of purchase).

Can I load bulk materials in the back of my mini van or in the trunk of my car?

No, you must have a truck or trailer for us to load bulk materials.

Are dyed mulches safe?

Yes! Our dyed mulches get their rich, dark, long lasting colors by utilizing all natural, non-toxic coloring agents. These coloring agents are derived from some of the Earth's most common elements. These include Carbon, Iron Oxide and Iron Oxide-Hydroxide.

How much mulch do I need?

We recommend about 3 inches of mulch in most situations. Playgrounds especially need more than 3 inches for a cushioned fall. At 3 inches deep, 1 cubic yard covers approximately 100 square feet. Multiply the length and width (in feet) of your coverage area, divide by 100 and this will be how many cubic yards you need.

How many cubic yards will my truck hold?

A typical half ton truck with a standard 6-foot bed can haul 2 cubic yards of mulch, a 1/2 cubic yard of stone, and 1 cubic yard of dirt.

How many bags equal 1 cubic yard?

1 cubic yard equals 27 cubic feet. If you are looking at 2 cubic foot bags, there are 13 1/2 bags to equal 1 cubic yard. If you are looking at bagged stone, most are 1/2 cubic foot, which equals 54 bags per cubic yard.

Is your mulch treated?

No, we do not treat any of our mulch with chemicals. Our dyed mulches are tinted with 100% natural elements.

What is the mold on top of my mulch?

When we get a hot, humid summer a fungus can sometimes grow on top of the mulch. Most fungi occur where there is a lot of shade and very little air movement. The mold can easily be cleared by tossing it with a shovel. Dyed and hardwood mulches compact causing dry conditions under the mulch. When this occurs, your landscape will be starved of water and oxygen. This will promote the growth of fungus and will raise soil temperatures through the summer months. Occasional aerating, raking, and watering will greatly decrease the chance of fungus and disease. The finer and dryer the mulch, the more prone it is to this problem. These types of fungi are not harmful, just a part of nature.

Will mulching prevent weeds from coming up?

No, it will slow them down, but won't stop them from coming up. Treflan put down on top of your mulch in the spring will prevent weeds from germinating. Weeds that are already up and growing will not be affected by Treflan.

What is the smallest amount of bulk material you can buy?

The smallest amount of bulk materials we can sell is a 1/2 cubic yard.

How many scoops is a yard?

Out of our skid loader, 2 level scoops equal 1 cubic yard.
